For 87 years, the Service League has quietly improved the lives of children in Cherokee County. The 2022-2023 League year continued that tradition. Between May 1, 2022 and April 30, 2023, League ladies volunteered over 8,400 hours. The willingness of ladies to take so much time away from their jobs, families, and routines to work to improve the lives of children in our community is a true inspiration.

Our volunteer efforts resulted in a resounding success for our fundraisers. The Golfing for the Children golf tournament continued to grow and thrive under the guide of Kelly Scott and Kelly Street. Riverfest, under the leadership of Rachel Ashe, went off without a hitch. The Reindeer Run for the Children 5k once again brought Christmas cheer to the community under the leadership of Becky French. The Annual Gala & Benefit, chaired by Amber Domino and Gwen Green, grew its mission to bring together community leaders and league members to celebrate the work of the League. Through collaboration and teamwork at our various fundraisers, League ladies succeeded in raising over \$145,000 to support children in our community this year!

The funds raised went back into our community in the form of casework, Christmas presents, scholarships, grants, and community service initiatives. Last summer, the scholarship committee, led by Brandy Bennett, distributed over \$15,500 to local graduates to support their education. Thanks to a conservative budget and successful fundraisers, this spring we were able to extend our reach in the community to support ten different non-profits through \$30,000 in grant funding.

A challenge for the League has always been sharing the work of the League with the community while protecting the privacy of those we serve. Families are often struggling when they turn to the League for support. One of the greatest accomplishments over the past year was a League video which brought together outgoing League members and an honorary member to share with the community who we are and what we do. The video is now featured on our website, and we hope future ladies and sponsors will be inspired to come join us in our mission.

Throughout this past year, League ladies came together in fellowship, collaboration and service to achieve the League's work. As an all volunteer organization, the accomplishments over the past year are astounding and set the ground work for continued success not only for year 88, but for many generations to come.

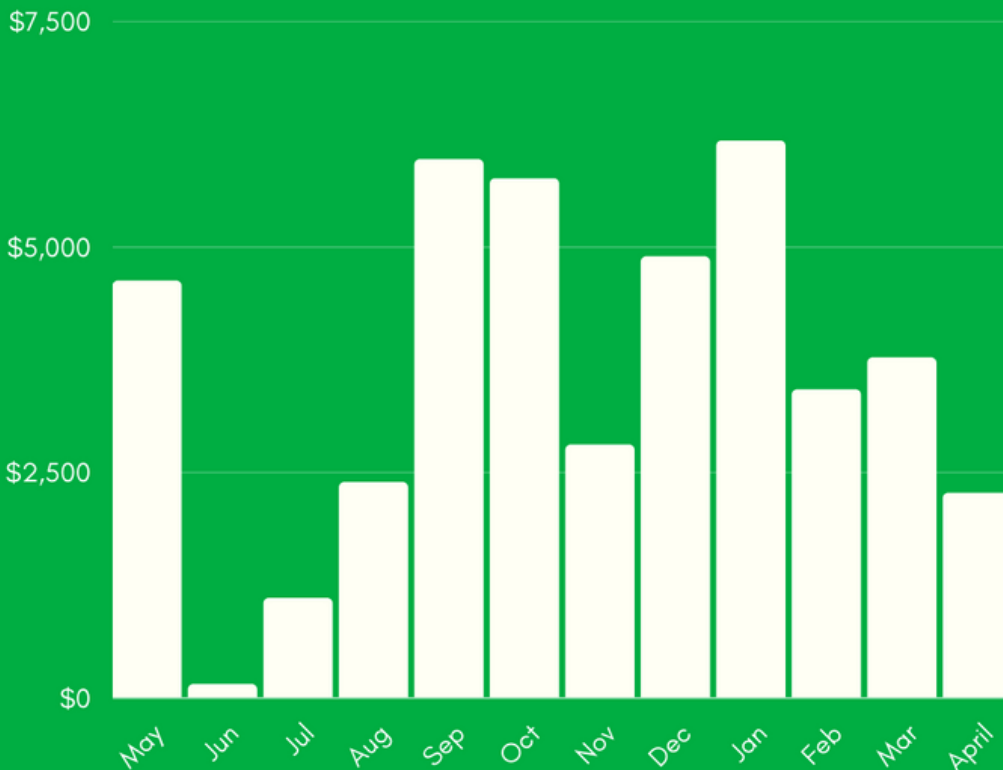
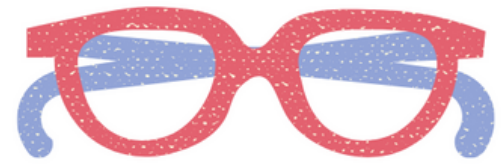

CASEWORK

Each year the League receives numerous requests from school social workers and counselors to help meet the basic needs of the children in Cherokee County. This year was no exception as we received over 180 requests. Our Caseworker and President-Elect, Marcey Stein, vetted each one to determine how the League might be able to help. This year we provided emergency dental care, over 50 pairs of eyeglasses, beds, rent, utilities, medical care and several other basic needs that so many often take for granted. In total we provided for 287 children and 139 families.

The stories we hear from these requests are heartbreaking. One family in particular is at the top of the list. This family had been experiencing homelessness for many months and was at a breaking point. Other community agencies had been able to help previously, but they needed one more week in a hotel before being able to move into transitional housing. The Service League was their last hope. We were able to meet the family's need and pay for a full week's stay in a hotel. In turn, this student is graduating in May. Without our support, this would not have been possible.

Stories like these are why we do what we do. We are excited and honored to continue the League's tradition and heritage of helping children.

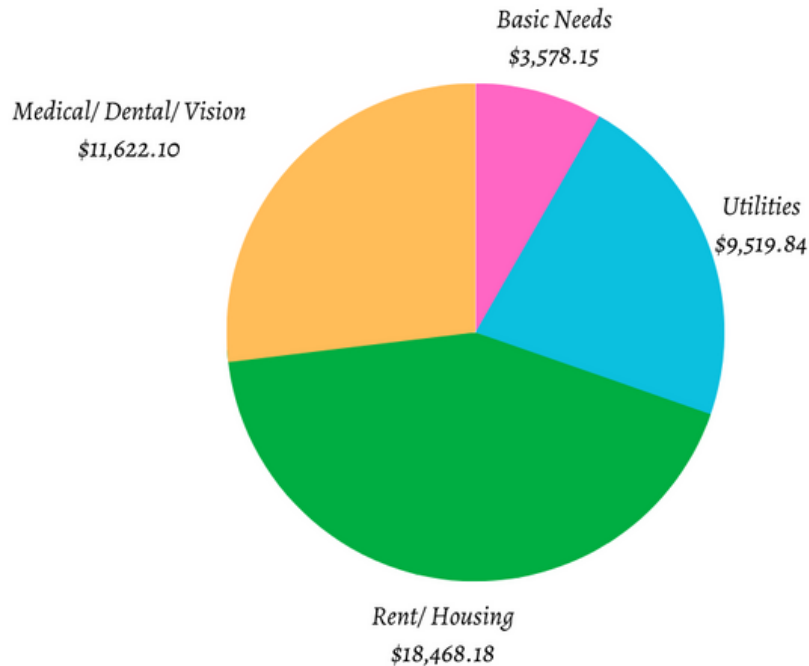

CASEWORK BY THE NUMBERS

Casework addresses children's needs ranging from housing, to utility assistance, to medical/dental or vision care. Housing, including emergency housing in hotels, formed the largest part of the League's work. This year, the League spent \$43,188.67 on casework helping children in need of Cherokee County.



COMMUNITY IMPACT GRANTS & DONATIONS

The League was pleased to award \$30,000 in community impact grants to assist other child focused organizations seeking to support the children of Cherokee County. Thanks to the success of the League's fundraisers over the past year, the League was able to use its resources to extend its reach in the community.

The grants were awarded to organizations seeking to help children in Cherokee County remove barriers so they could grow and prosper. The grants will provide children with scholarships for summer camps, provide long term housing for children, assist single mothers with transportation and childcare, and provide medical care for children. This year's 2023 recipients included: Cherokee Homeless Coalition, Must Ministries, Love Like Reed, Cherokee Youth Foundation, Forever Fed, Bethesda Medical Clinic, Hidden Acres, Camp Gideon, 4-H Club, and Ferst Readers.


In addition to community impact grants, the League made donations throughout the League year to other non-profits in our community including Must Ministries, The Children's Haven and the Sheriff's Department Christmas Joy Program totaling over \$14,500.

SCHOLARSHIPS

In May 2022, the Service League continued our history of providing need-based scholarships to seniors graduating from high schools in the Cherokee County School District. The scholarships are awarded based on need, academic success, community involvement, and extra-curricular activities.

The scholarship committee carefully reviewed each application, placing an emphasis on the need of the scholarship applicant. A total of \$15,500 was awarded. All applicants selected by the committee represent some of the best and brightest from Cherokee County.

CHRISTMAS FAMILIES

One of League's favorite things to do every year is shop for kids at Christmas. Children who receive these gifts are identified by school counselors and social workers who work with families to complete a Christmas wish list of needs and wants. The needs were basic everyday items from blankets and towels to underwear, shirts, pants, coats, and socks.

This year, the League shopped for 176 kids, committing to spend \$200 per child. Because of our community's donations, sponsorships, and participation in fundraising events, we were able support the requests for big ticket items like bikes, tablets and laptops to help make Christmas extra special. In total the League spent \$39,763.31 for children at Christmas.

We are grateful for the donations from Fowler and Donegal Insurance Agencies, the Blue Ridge Bar Association, and Cobb EMC Community Foundation to make this all possible. We are also grateful to Safe Kids Cherokee who provided helmets for all children who requested bikes or scooters.

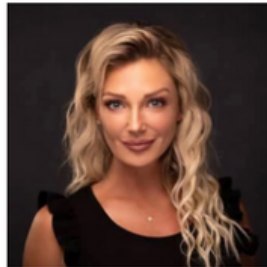

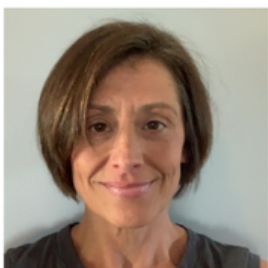

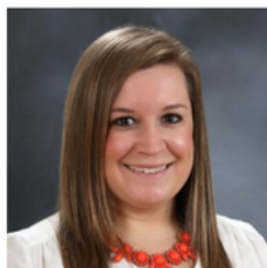
