Between May 2023 and April 2024, League ladies volunteered thousands of hours, taking time around their busy schedules to work to improve the lives of children in our community.

We would not be successful in our mission to help children if it wasn't for our yearly fundraising efforts. We began the League year off in June with another successful Golfing FORE! the Children golf tournament which was held at a new location, the Fairways of Canton. This is always a fun day on the course, and we are looking forward to our 2024 tournament coming up in June.

Our biggest fundraiser of the year, Riverfest, was held at the end of September and was a massive success with record-breaking attendance. It was a beautiful weekend with over 28,000 patrons joining us at Etowah River Park. We also added additional Arts & Crafts vendors for a more extensive shopping experience for everyone and received great feedback on the additions.

The Reindeer Run for the Children once again included a 1 mile Fun Run for the kids, a Peachtree Road Race 5k qualifier, and as a new option for runners this year, a 10k course. Despite the rainy weather, we hosted 300 runners, had a great time celebrating the winners, and loved seeing everyone come out and bring their Christmas cheer..

In January, we held our third annual Service League Gala & Benefit. It was a beautiful evening that brought together community leaders and League members. We celebrated the work and mission of the League while also honoring other individuals and organizations of our community who do great work helping children along side us.

Through the many hours of hard work from our amazing fundraising Chairs and their committees, League ladies succeeded in raising over \$190,000 to support children in our community this year! The funds raised went towards helping our most vulnerable population in our community in the form of casework, Christmas gifts, scholarships, grants, and community service initiatives.

Throughout this past year, I have been so honored and proud to watch my League sisters come together, assume the best in each other, work as a team, and serve the children of our community with their gifts and talents. CASEWORK

The League is deeply dedicated to serving children in need in Cherokee County through our casework initiatives. This year, we received over 260 casework requests, illuminating the pressing community need. Led by caseworker and President-Elect, Melissa Wehunt, we provided essential services such as emergency dental care, over 70 pairs of eyeglasses, utility and rent assistance, medical care, and other basic needs, reaffirming our commitment to making a meaningful impact.

Each casework request we receive represents a family facing various struggles. One story that stood out this year involved a family dealing with the unexpected passing of the mother just before Christmas. This put them under financial strain, and we were able to help by covering a couple of their utility payments. It's moments like these that remind us of the importance of our work in supporting families during challenging times.

We are thrilled and deeply honored to carry forward the longstanding tradition and heritage of the League in providing crucial assistance to children. This is not just a legacy, but a testament to our ongoing commitment to serving the community's most vulnerable members.







CASEWORK BY THE NUMBERS

Casework addresses children's needs ranging from housing, to utility assistance, to medical/dental or vision care. Housing, including emergency housing in hotels, formed the largest part of the League's work. This year, the League spent \$69,710.10 on casework helping children in need of Cherokee County.



\$50,000 IN COMMUNITY IMPACT GRANTS

The Service League was honored to award \$50,000 in Community Impact Grants to various non-profit organizations committed to enhancing the lives of children in Cherokee County. These grants were awarded following a rigorous evaluation process led by a committee of League members, adhering to specific criteria designed to ensure maximum benefit to the children in Cherokee County.

The recipients were Anna Crawford Children's Center, MUST Ministries, Safe Kids Cherokee, Cherokee Family Violence Center, Cherokee County Homeless Coalition, 4H, Cherokee Makerspace, Cherokee Youth Foundation, Circle of Friends, Highland Rivers and Bethany Place.

Overall, the Service League of Cherokee County's annual Community Impact Grants reflect the League's unwavering commitment to supporting children and families in need, fostering a brighter future for the community.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Not only does the League serve children in need through fundraising efforts, but we also have a passion to serve through various community service projects throughout the year. Projects this year included creating and providing over 500 hygiene packs for Give A Kid A Chance, packing lunches for the MUST summer lunch program, and building 250 nonperishable birthday cake kits for CCSD schools. Our wonderful Provisional Class continued the hygiene pack project and delivered over 1,000 packs to schools throughout the year as well! Over \$4,600 was spent towards providing items for all of these wonderful projects on top of receiving donations from our community.

Our League members also donated their time volunteering in various capacities with other amazing children-based organizations including A Night to Shine and Holiday Lights of Hope. We are always happy to serve with other organizations working to improve the lives of children in our community.

In May 2023, the Service League continued our history of providing need-based scholarships to seniors graduating from high schools in the Cherokee County School District. The scholarships are awarded based on need, academic success, community involvement, and extra-curricular activities.

The scholarship committee carefully reviewed each application, placing an emphasis on the need of the scholarship applicant. A total of \$25,000 was awarded. All applicants selected by the committee represent some of the best and brightest from Cherokee County.



CHRISTMAS FAMILIES

The Service League's Christmas Families program embodies the spirit of giving by ensuring that children's wishes and essential needs are met during the holiday season. Each child provides a list of wants and needs, allowing us to tailor our gifts to their preferences while also addressing practical necessities. We commit to spend a minimum of \$200 per child, ensuring that their holiday experience is filled with joy. Through the generous support of sponsorships and donations from Fowler Insurance, The Blue Ridge Bar Association, and Cobb EMC Community Foundation, we were able to provide big-ticket items such as bikes and electronics, making the holiday season memorable for these children.

This year, we shopped for 154 children, with a total spend of over \$38,000. Additionally, we extend our gratitude to Safe Kids Cherokee for their contribution of helmets for all children who requested bikes and scooters. These collaborative efforts showcase the power of community support and reaffirm our commitment to making a positive impact in the lives of children and families during the holiday season and beyond.

The family friendly event featured a large children's area and a variety of local entertainment. Scarecrows and fall decor set the scene for a fall festival unlike any other in our community.



As the flagship fundraiser for the League's work, the festival set a record and raised over \$155,000 to help us continue in our mission of helping children in Cherokee County!

The 20th Annual Run for the Children was held on Dec. 2, 2023. The Service League was excited to add the first 10K race to the Cherokee County region. Race events included a 1 mile Fun Run, and Peachtree Qualifying 5K and 10K races.
